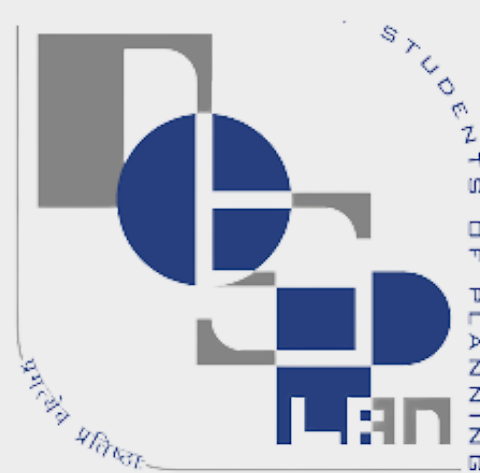

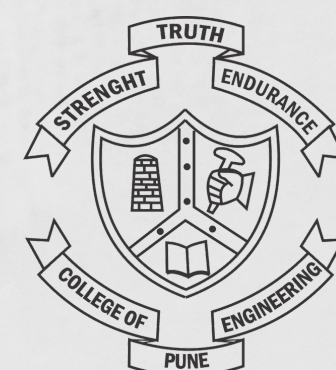

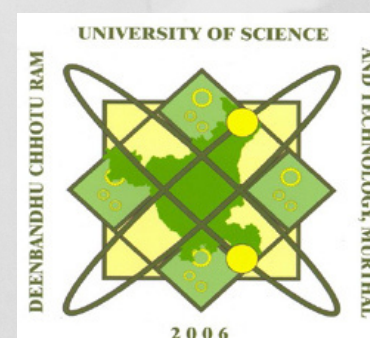

Crime free spaces are the basic foundation for equal and prosperous development. The challenge is to make spaces crime free. The teams have to study the best practice of Crime Prevention through Environmental Design through a Case Study and analyse the design principles. The principles are to be applied on the chosen Case Area.

Deliverables

- A Presentation not exceeding 15+2 slides.
- A Detailed Report as a supporting document not exceeding more than 10,000 words (excluding the cover page, acknowledgments, table of contents, list of figures, tables, references, endnotes and annexures).
- A Concept Note briefly explaining the design considerations and innovation methods used. The concept note should not exceed 1000 words.

Theme – Site design

A mobility challenge where participants would be given a site where they would be taken for a site visit. The students are to understand the existing problems during the site visit.

Note :

- **No of participants per team - 6 members.**
- **No. of teams per college - 1 team**
- The participants would be taken to the site a few hours prior to the beginning of the competition
- The teams would get 40 hours to prepare their connectivity ideas and structures
 - **Day 1: Site visit, Survey, and Preparation**
 - **Day 3: Presentation**
- The solutions must be relevant and cost-effective. The participants can give designs, models, and/or approaches for the same.
- There will be a deduction of points on the delay of submission.

POLICY INTERVENTION AND ANALYSIS



Theme - Heat Resilience: A new era approach in Master Planning processes

Extreme heat is a growing concern for cities. A recent report by United Nations Environment Programme states that many cities could warm as much as 4°C by 2100. Urban heat island effect as a consequence of rapidly changing physical landscape of cities has two-pronged effects: it poses high public health risk with increasing episodes of heat waves and adds to the energy load of the cities by increasing cooling requirements. Cooling strategies have therefore become necessary to be integrated with the city planning process.

Deliverables

- Concept Note- briefly explaining the underlying threat with the city and strategies including the urban design and infrastructure and innovation methods used. The concept note should not exceed 1000 words.
- Presentation- not exceeding 15+2 slides.
- Detailed Report- as a supporting document not exceeding 10,000 words (excluding the cover page, acknowledgments, table of contents, list of figures, tables, references, endnotes and annexures).

Judgement Criteria

1. Approach to the subject
2. Establishing the need for Heat Resilience in the city and analysis
3. Cooling strategies for the city and a clear understanding of how to implement them
4. Innovation and originality of the work
5. Presentation skills and fluency
6. Applicability of the policy intervention proposed
7. The ability of time management during the presentation

- **No of participants per team** - 2 to 4 members.
- **No. of teams per college** - maximum 2 teams
- Student participants will be assigned with various cities in India and will need to put together a city action plan for heat resilience.
- Total time for presentation not exceeding 10+2 minutes.

Theme – Disclosed a Week Prior to the Event

This would be an inter-college debate where the event will take 3 parts.

- **Qualifiers:** This round shall be a qualifier round. Each team would be required to speak for their topics that are allotted by DRAW or TOSS in the presence of both the teams for smooth conduct. List of topics would be given out a week prior to the convention.

1. EXPRESS – A speaker from AFFIRMATIVE team shall be allowed 4 MINUTES to put their primary points forward followed by the speaker from the NEGATIVE team.
2. CROSS QUESTION – Series of arguments arising from cross-questioning by each team will go on for 3 MINUTES.
3. JUSTIFY – each team is allowed 1 MINUTE for closing arguments or statements or remarks.

Top 4 scorers qualify to Semi finals.

- **Semi-finals:** Topics are revealed 15 minutes prior to the event. The highest and the least scoring teams form combination-1. The remaining two teams form the combination-2. Series of arguments will go on in cross question round.

- **Finals:** 2 highest scoring teams will compete against each other. Topic is revealed 15 MINUTES prior to the event.

Note :

- While the winners and runners would be decided in the finals, the 3rd place would be the third-highest scorer in the semi-finals round.

The quiz would be carried out in the following manner.

Round 1: Buzzer Round

This is a buzzer round in which first 3 buzzers are considered. All teams are allowed a duration of 30 SECONDS for pressing the buzzer, post which a duration of 5 SECONDS to answer the question. If a team is unable or fails to answer upon pressing the buzzer, the question passes to the next group.

Round 2: Q n A

This round, 5 questions will be asked to each team. 5 points will be awarded for every correct answer in which 2 points will be deducted upon taking a hint. All teams are allowed a duration of 15 SECONDS to answer the question. However, time is paused during the hints. Wrong answers are not allowed. In case of any wrong answer, that team will not be asked any further questions

Round 3: Rapid Fire

In this final round, team 1 & 2 are continuously asked a series of questions for 2 minutes with a gap of 5 seconds after each question to answer respectively. The team that bags maximum number of correct answers will be declared winner

Note :

- **No. of participants** - *Each college is allowed a maximum of one team of two students.*

Judgement Criteria

1. The participants will be judged by judges according to the points scored
2. Team that answers maximum no. of questions correctly wins.

To maintain uniformity participants are requested to follow the same flow as given below.

- c) Analysis
- d) Recommendation/proposal

And the proposals should be relevant to the study and innovative proposals would be one of the considerations in marking

Particulars

- **No. of participants** - Each college is allowed a maximum of 1 team of 4+ 1(associate editor)students.
- Only 2 members will be allowed to present the jury.
- While answering all 4 people will be allowed to speak
- 10+3 minutes per presentation.
- There is no restriction to the number of sheets presented.
- Each college will be provided/allowed a maximum of one single sided panel. Panel size: Dimensions-4X8 feet.
- Sheets will be pinned up on the first day of NOSPlan.
- The result given by the jury will be final no other changes will be entertained.

- Participants must pick from the chits with the core material. Whichever material they have got from the chits will be their core material for model.
- Basic stationary will be provided by the college.
- The result given by the jury will be final no other changes will be entertained.

Particulars:

- The participants will be provided with the canvas before the commencement of the event.
- **No. of participants:** A group of 2-4 members from each participating college
- Participants will have to be innovative enough to make their artwork communicable in the context of the topic.
- **Time limit** of 1 hour 30 minutes +10 minutes.

Note :

- 1.College will be providing basic requirements.
- 2.Basic requirement consist of Paint, Palette, Canvas Board (4×3ft), Brushes of 3 sizes (standard size), Pencil, erasers, sharpeners, scale.
- 3.Extra brushes can be brought by the participants
- 4.Students should not be interchanged once the event commences.
- 5.The result given by the jury will be final no other changes will be entertained.

Note :

- The photos must be given a title of maximum of 5 Words describing the moments of the picture.
- For capturing the photos , phone or camera can be used by the participants
- Minor editing to the photograph is allowed.

- Team can have additional 2 (8+2) people for designing, makeup, music and lights.
- All the colleges are requested to give their concept and music on or before 16-03-2022.
- For any Visual effect, projectors and screens will be provided by the host college.

Note :

- Entry teams are expected from each of the participating colleges.
- Participants are required to provide the music in an MP3 format.
- Participation will be limited to minimum 3 to maximum 9 on stage participants and 2 members for music and lights.
- If participating college brings any singer (including background music), they would be benefited with 5 brownie points.
- Performance time will be 6 minutes and a bell will be ring on the 5th minute and then the music will be stopped at the 6th minute.

MUSIC BANDS

Particulars:

- Participating team from each college will be given time for Preparation prior to the event.
- No materials will be provided by the host college for preparation purpose.
- Participants will not be allowed to refer to the lyrics while singing.

Note :

- Time allotted for each performance is maximum of 10 minutes.
- The participants must get their musical instruments along with them, least 3 Instruments (including a percussion instrument).
- Choice of song on theme but the song should not include any kind of offensive words and vulgarity. Any such activity might cause the disqualification.
- Language will be restricted with HINDI and ENGLISH.
- The band should have a minimum of 3 members and a maximum of 8 members.
- Different guitars can be considered as deterrent instruments.
- The participating bands have to submit the lyrics of the songs at the time of event registration.
- The decision of the organizing team shall final.

Judgement Criteria

The performance shall be judged on,

- Song selection
- Quality and Clarity
- Relevant to the theme
- Rhythm and their appeal to the audience
- Variety of instruments,
- The way they portray fusion
- Band chemistry
- Time management on stage.

STREET PLAY

Theme – The Fear of Art: Contemporary Art Censorship

Particulars:

- No microphones, Speakers will be allowed or available and No musical instruments are allowed. Teams can sing / dance by themselves to create the necessary music or sound.
- No Props or costume or any material will be provided by the host college.
- Teams should maintain decency and decorum in the behavior, attire and performance.
- No Time for rehearsal / Stage practice / final rehearsal will be given.
- All participants must report at the venue at least one hour prior the commencement of the event.

Note :

- From each college, one team comprising of minimum 8 and maximum 10 participants shall be allowed.
- **Time Limit:** Teams should restrict their play in 9 mins (8+1) time. First warning bell will be given after 8 mins and final warning bell after 9mins. There will be negative marking if teams exceed the performance time.
- All the colleges are requested to give their concept on or before 16-03-2022 to the host college.
- Decision of Judges will be final and binding on all teams.

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BOX CRICKET

Particulars:

- The event will be a knockout cricket competition.
- The team that survives till end wins. It will be a six over match.
- If there happens to be a tie, then a super over will be conducted.
- Each team will be given 3 mins break at the end of innings.

Note :

- Participation is limited to one team of 6 members from each college.
- At least 2 girl participant is mandatory for participation.
- Each bowler can bowl a maximum of two overs.
- The bowling will be underarm. 4 continuous dead balls will lead to the dismissal of the bowler.
- At least one over should be bowled by a girl.
- Each wide ball carries 1 run.
- Direct shot i.e. six will result in wicket of the batsman. After falling of two wickets it is mandatory for a girl to bat.

Fouls:

An attempt to unfairly disadvantage an opponent through certain types of physical contact is illegal and will be considered as a personal foul.

MIXED VOLLEYBALL

Each team will be made up of a maximum of 6 players on the court with a minimum of 2 females. In an event that a team cannot field 6 players, the following combination will apply:

Teams can play with: -

- 1. 6 players, with a minimum of 2 persons of each gender on court at all times;**
2. Teams can make an unlimited amount of substitutions during play.

The game structure for the preliminary rounds of the competition is as follows:

- 16-minute halves
- A half time break of 2 minutes

Note :

- In finals and playoffs, the same structure will be followed. If a draw results during any of the finals, a coin is tossed to decide who will serve first, and then an extra five minutes is played in which the team with the highest score at the end of extra time will be declared the winner.
- If the scores are still even at the end of extra time, teams will continue to play until one team gets two points ahead.

CHESS

- Matches of 10 | 2 rapid will be played between teams (4 Players + 1 Extra Player).
- Every round will be a knockout round.
- Colors will be decided by a toss.
- If a match is tied, a tiebreak of a 3+2 blitz game is played between one player sent from each team as a mini-match.
- Draws count as 0.5 points and are the equivalent of half a win and half a loss for prize calculation.
- If a match is still tied after the mini-match tiebreaker, a single Armageddon game will be played: White 5+0, Black 3+0, Black gets draw odds.
- The player who will win the toss at the start of Armageddon chooses his color.

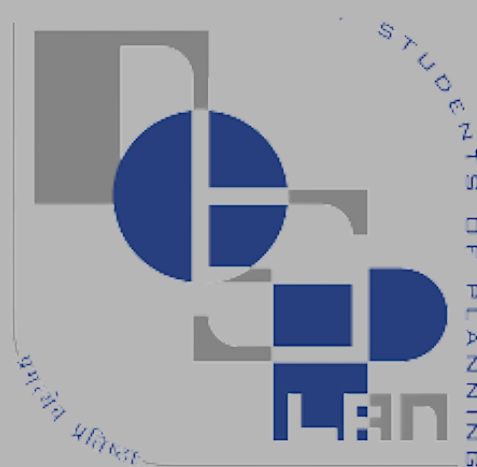
